Message from the New Chairman

~ ONGOING AND COMPLETED PROJECTS

- Robert Lightbourne High School Training

A pest identification workshop was held at the Robert Lightbourne High school on June 3rd 2008. The presenter was Dr Dwight Robinson. This is a continuation of training activities with the first JOAM school organic club.

- Knowing and Growing Workshop
JOAM in partnership with Networked Intelligence for Development held a facilitators' workshop on information technologies in support of organic agriculture from May 28th to June 1st. The workshop was held at the University of the West Indies, Mona campus and involved thirty-five participants from Jamaica, Belize, Dominica, Guyana, St Lucia, Suriname and Trinidad. The participants were introduced to participatory peer-to-peer training methods and to the use of ICT to effectively manage organic production as well as build and nurture relationships with organic agents such as importers, traders and wholesalers.
- Hope Pasture's Composting Workshop
The first of three composting workshops was held on June 21st in the Park at Hope Pastures. Twenty-six participants were exposed to the fundamentals of composting.
